- Develop confidence in sharing their own opinions and receive feedback.


EXPECTED OUTCOMES

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Students are required to do the following tasks:

- Come-up with a research idea and develop presentation slide
- Share the slides with the colleagues, supervisors and make improvement

MFS 552: Internship/Project Work

SCOPE

This course provides practical opportunity for carrying out independent research/project work in one of the areas: (i) forestry (ii) wildlife (iii) watershed and (iv) forest utilizations (NTFPs). This provides the students to apply their classroom knowledge in real field activities and develop hands on application skills. Further, it offers an opportunity to gain work experience in the areas of their professional theme by spending substantial time in the field or at community setting.

OBJECTIVES

- Understand the real field situation and apply knowledge to achieve as per the set project objectives.
- Gain and sharpen soft skills (such as teamwork, communication and problem-solving) and apply to generate quality data.
- Develop ability to adapt in workplace in their respective areas
- Maintain professional ethics and prepare quality research/project report

EXPECTED OUTCOMES

Upon completion of this field work-based course, students will be able to conduct research/project work independently, become sellable to operate self-enterprise and equipped for further professional career development.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

The amount of time for internship or project work is 13 weeks and students are required to do the following tasks:

- Field work plan finalization
- Objective based literature review and consult experts
- Establish field contact, consult, and operationalize the methods in field work activities
- Carry out fieldwork, generate data and analyze data
- Maintain regular contact with the supervisors and field supervisors
- Prepare research/project draft report and finalize

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
